## Revolutionary Claims.

STATE OF VERMONT, }  
Chittenden County, ss. }

ON this seventeenth day of August A. D. 1832, personally appeared in open Court, before the Honorable *County* Court for the County of Chittenden, now sitting, *ss*  
*Graves* a resident of *Series* in the County of Chittenden and State of Vermont, aged *75* years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed June 7, 1832, That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated.

*That I was drafted from Putnam Massachusetts on the 20th December 1746 and joined the company under the command of Captain James Galloway and the Regiment commanded by Colonel ~~Graves~~ and marched to Albany State of New York thence we marched to Ticonderoga at the fort in the State of New York and remained at the fort until the 20th of March 1747. General Schuyler was there a part of the winter and had a verbal discharge on the 20th of March after I had served three months.*

*And on the fore part of June 1748 I was drafted from the company in the Town of Chilton Vermont and joined the company under the command of Captain Elijah Galusha and afterwards under the command of Captain Gideon Brownson and marched to Putnam and remained there one month and was dismissed and was employed as a guard principally. And in the month of May 1789 the fore part of it I was drafted from Chilton Vermont for nine months and I hired an other man to take my place and paid him fifteen dollars.*

*And in the same year 1781 or 2 I was called out in several expeditions do not recollect the time but went to Grafton at one time and to Putnam and at an other time all in Vermont and was out as much as three months in the whole time.*
