On the 25. day of August 1832—
personally appeared before me Sherman West
a judge of Herkimer County Courts, Thomas Kellogg
resident in the town of Russia, County of Herkimer
and State of New York, aged seventy nine years,
who being first duly sworn according to law
doth, on his oath, make the following declaration,
in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress
passed 7. June 1832 That, he entered the service
of the United States, under the following named officers, and
served as here instated. He lived in the town of
Pittsfield, County of Berkshire and State of Massachusetts
at the commencement of the revolutionary war, and had lived there
for a number of years previous to that time. Now the said
Thomas Kellogg declares, that in or about the month
of December 1775. or 1776 (they are not exactly recollecter)
he entered in the said town of Pittsfield under Capt.
Amos Rathbun (Col. & Regiment not recollecter) in
General Manges Brigade in the Massachusetts line
and was stationed at Fort Mifflin, and served three
Months, was then discharged and returned home
to Pittsfield. Now the said Thomas Kellogg further
declares, that in or about the month of Sept., 1777
he was drafted at Pittsfield under Capt. Barlow
and marched to Manchester, and from thence to Stillwater
in the State of New York, and was stationed there, and was
within one mile of the battle ground, at the time that
Burgoyne was taken, Capt. Rathbun's company
not being called into the action, and after Burgoyne
had surrendered he the said Thomas Kellogg returned
with Capt. Rathbun to Pittsfield, and had served
in this tour two months. And the said Thomas
Kellogg further declares, that in or about the
month of July 1780. he entered in the service
of the United States in the continental army under
Lieut. Isaac English (the Capt. Livingston) at Pittsfield
in Col. Sprout's Regiment in the Massachusetts
line
