ss. On this 27th day of July A. D. 1832

personally appeared in open Court, before me the Just Judge of the County of Cayuga and state of New-York, now setting, Ebenezer Phelps a resident of Seneca in the County of Cayuga and State of New-York, aged Seventy two years, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress, passed June 7th, 1832: - That he entered the service under the following named officers, and served as herein stated: - that about the last of August or first of September A. D. 1776 at the town of Richmond in the County of Berkshire in the State of Massachusetts he entered the service of the United States in the company of Militia commanded by Captain, Hugh as he believes, Lieutenant - - Colt in the Regiment commanded by Col. - - Simonds as he believes, that he marched with said company to the White Plains in the State of New-York where he was discharged in the month of November thereafter, having served about the term of two months.

He further declares that about the month of December A. D. 1776 at the town of Richmond aforesaid, he again entered the service of the United States in the company of Militia commanded by Captain Amos Nathaniel in Col. - - Simonds, Regiment as he believes, that he marched with said company to ^{Sturbridge in the State of Massachusetts near} Leonard's Forge in the State of New-York where he was discharged in the month of March 1777, having served a term of three months.

He further declares that about the month of June A. D. 1777 at the town of Berkshire aforesaid he again entered the service of the United States in the company of Militia commanded by Capt. - - Aaron Rowley (the name of his Colonel he does not now remember). that he marched with said company to ^{Barnington} Still Water in the State of ^{Vermont} New-York in the month of July thereafter having served a term of ^{about} ~~two~~ weeks from thence to ~~near~~ ^{White} Shattsbury in the State of New-York, from thence towards White Hall, and thence to Fort Ann, ^{thence to Still Water} near where he continued until he was discharged, that he was discharged at Still Water in the State of New-York aforesaid, having served a term of about three weeks and returned home for the purpose of
