

next Spring in the month of June, was again drafted  
 to go to Schoharie went in the Company commanded by <sup>Capt</sup> Aaron  
 Hale. marched to Schoharie to the Middle Fort: was there and at  
 the Upper fort for two months or more. while there Captain Hale  
 deserted and run away. deponants Company was then put under  
 the Command of Captain Hager, as long as we remained in  
 Schoharie from there we marched up to Fort Plain or  
 the Mohawk and remained there and at Fort Herkimer  
 until our term was out - no fighting or any thing of consequence  
 seen took place while there was discharged and returned  
 home to Noble town, remained home until the fall of 1780  
 the whole of the Militia was then called out on the  
 Alarm of Buller & Brants on the Mohawk and deponant  
 marched with the Company commanded by Capt David  
 Mc Kinstry, the Regiment of Col. Robert Van Nempelaer and  
 on the way at Greenbush was joined by Col Robert Van Nempelaer  
 and all marched together to near Fort  
 Hunter, there encamped for the night but on discovering the  
 fire of the building burnt by Buller & Brant we took up  
 our march again in pursuit of them and pursued them  
 all night, and at Canajoharie overtook them and a  
 battle took place ~~with the British~~ near night and during  
 the night the British made the escape deponant  
 was out on this tower one month was then discharged

Brigade of Gen. Glover to what deponent Company  
belonged march down to Albany and while there  
the three months for what deponent was drafted  
expired & he was discharged and came home  
to Noble<sup>Noble</sup>town. And the Spring following in the  
month of June 1778 deponent was again drafted  
for two months and marched from Nobletown in the  
Company commanded by Capt. Jonathan Groves &  
Edward Vaux was ranked as Ensign to Cherry  
Valley then joined the Continental troops comman-  
ded by Capt. Ballard; during the second month while  
deponent was there the Indians in great numbers  
came there and burnt and destroyed every thing within  
the fort and not within reach of our fire they were  
so numerous that we durst not sally from the fort  
after them. Deponent's Company left Cherry Valley and  
went to Fort Plain on the Mohawk river and  
remained there until his two months had expired  
was then discharged and returned home to Noble  
town. and in the latter part of September of the  
same year deponent was then drafted again to go  
to Fort Hill, in the Company commanded by <sup>Capt</sup> Joshua Whitney  
Lieutenant David McKinstry, and remained at Fort Hill & West  
Point for one month was then discharged and came  
home to Noble town. and remained home until the
