

> THE HEAT IN AUSTRALIA. -Mr. E. Meriam. of Brooklyn, noticing the fact that on Thursday, the thermometer in some situations ran up as high as 98 degrees, remarks :- We have our Australian records before us, recording temperatures of 115, 118, and 120 degrees maximum on four several days, and on one of those days it was at 118 for nearly a whole day. We have the Arctic record also before us, of 58 to 594 degrees below zero, for a cold term of four and a quarter consecutive days. The two compared together show a difference of one hundred and seventy-nine and a quarter degrees temperature between those two places of observation. That goes beyond any thing we ever have in this latitude.

RELL MARKETTE DAY

REMARKABLE ESCAPE OF A VESSEL FROM SINKING AT SEA .- The bark Swan, Captain Barker, of this city, says the Baltimore Sun of the 17th inst, made a most miraculous escape from foundering on a late trip from here to Rio Janeiro. When some two days' sail from Pernambuco, she suddenly sprung a leak, and in order to save her the Captain bore up for that port, where she arrived, making water very fast and upon her arrival there it was found necessary to run her immediately ashore to prevent her sinking. An examination then showed that the leak proceeded from a hole in her bottom through which a carpenter's chisel was projecting. It was also ascertained that the chisel had fallen into the pump while the ship was being built, three years since, and by the action of the pump had gradually chiselled a hole through the bottom planking four inches in diameter, the exact dimensious of the pump orifice. The piece of plank, which is three inches thick, was cut out, and with the chisel and the plate of copper, the jagged edges of which had prevented the chisel from falling through, were secured by Captain Hinckly, of New York, and taken by him to that city. Had not the vessel been able to reach port when she did, she must inevitably have foundered, and her fate, like many another noble ship, been enveloped entirely in

PUGET SOUND .- This is a new field for emigration on the coast of the Pacific. A newspaper has recently been started at Steilacoom, which sets forth the mary advantages of that country for the purposes of settlement.

"We venture the assertion, that few portions of the habitable globe are better favored with natural advantages than is our own. Situnted on the great highway of oceans, the Pacific-and having a scaboard of two hundred miles in extent, the best of harbors, abounding in every quality of fish, and dotted with islands, whose, as is the main land bordering the Sound, are covered with gigantic forestsa country whose soil is of the richest mould, with unlimited water power in its streams, and the earth of which is filled with useful minerals; it only needs to have these resources ful ly developed to make it the granary of the

It then proceeds to tell us that it was only when Oregon was settled, and a demand for lumber arose in California, that a few farmers found their way to the Sound. The town of Steillacoom, which has now about 100 dwelling houses and stores, was marked by a single hut only in 1854. Now the state of things is widely different.

"We have a church, a daily school, a publie press. A wharf has just been completed, that affords berths for large vessels at all stages of the lide; and we hope ere many days, as Congress has made the necessary appropriations, to see an ocean steamer laying along 4ide, giving us direct communication with San Francisco. Congress has appropriated thirty thousand dollars for constructing a military river to Fort Steillacoom-which will give us a large portion of the Oregon travel."

A party of Indians from Hudson's Bay, had visited the settlement and committed several seamen. robberies. It was feared that they would become troublesome.

PRESENTATION OF THE SANDWICH ISLANDS PLENIPOTENTIARY TO THE PRESIDENT .- The Hon. W. L. Lee, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of the Sandwich Islands to the Government of the United States, was presented to the President of the U.S. last week. In his address to the President, the Envoy, as reported by the Union, returned thanks to the government and people of the United States, for the lively interest and tender concern they have ever manifested for the happiness and welfare of the Hawaiian islanders, adding:

"It is to the noble philanthropy of the United States that those Islands are indebted for the blessings of Christianity and civilization; it is to the warm sympathy and generout support of the United States they owe their present prosperity and independence; and I am instructed to assure your excellency they are deeply sensible of the obligations these continued favors have imposed upon them."

"In responding, the President expressed the gratification which it afforded him to receive an envoy extraordinary and minister plenipotentiary of the Hawaiian Islands, and his appreciation of the kind sentiments on the part of the king, chiefs, and people of those islands towards the United States, of which the envoy had given such an agreeable assurance. He alluded to the establishment of American missions on those islands; to the deep interest in which the United States had regarded the Christianization, prosperity and advancement of that interesting people; and assured the envoy that that interest had never been more sincere and ardent than at the present time.'

Functions of Consuls.-1. A Consul may be authorized to communicate directly with the Government near which he resides; but he does not thereby acquire the diplomatic privileges of a Minister.

2. Nor does he, as Consul, acquire such privileges by being appointed as he may at the same time, Charge d' Affaires. 3. To the question whether a Consul can

solemnize marriage or not as Consul, if is wholly immeterial whether he be or not a subject of the foreign Government. 4. The exterritoriality of foreign Consuls in

Turkey and other Mohammedan countries is entirely independent of the fact of diplomatic representation, and is maintained by the difference of law and religion, being but incidental to the fact of the established exterritorialty of Christians in all countries not Christian.

5. Consuls, as international commercial agents, originated in the colonial municipalities of the Latin Christians in the Levant, which municipalities were self-governing through their "Consuls," the ancient title of

municipal magistrates in Italy. 6. Rights of private exterritoriality having ceased to exist in Christendam, foreign Consuls have ceased to be municipal magistrates of their countrymen there; but they still con-

tinue not only international agents, but also administrative and judicial functionaries of their countrymen incountries outside of Christendom.

A late number of The London Mark Lane Express says that the present season in England has been so backward that the wheat harvest cannot be gathered before Septemberabout three weeks later than usual, and the delay will be further increased by the shortness of the days and darkness of the weather at that season. In consequence of this fears are entertained that reserves of old wheat usually held over to mix with the new, will be exhausted before the new can be gathered and threshed; and this scarcity will be further increased by the condition of affairs on the continent, there not being a single European Marcet from which the British can draw supplies.



The position of the chain shows that it is elevated by the iron ridge over which it is hove in, and which turns the links of the chain, and brings them into position for the pawl. which falls upon thom, to engage with each link as it passes over the ridge, which must, in all cases, hold toe chain up as high as the slope of the hawse pipe will admit, and not have the chain interfere with the top of the pipe when running out. The socket in which the top end of the pawl works, must be placed at that distance above the hawse hole which will allow the pawl to come in contact with the chain in such a position that the bottom part of the link will hear against the back side of the iron ridge, [or ab. ft its center] and the top part of the link against the center of the pawl, as may be seen in the engraving While, in order to bring the back side of the ridge in more perfect contact with the lower part of the link, there is a wedge placed upon the deck, beneath the ridge; the upper surface of which is parallel with the natural line of the chain, as represented by the cut, the ridge always being placed at a right angle with the Ship's Bow or center line. The side chocks, which are cast on the iron ridge, are here represented by dotted lined only, in orderto show correctly the position of the chain, and also the stopper.

In this position I broke ground and began to drag directly for the ship astern of me, and it being 10 o'clock at night. I was afraid the other ship might not see us dragging until too late to leave her sufficient time to ship or break her cable, consequently I tet a second and large auchor go, and having the pawls out of the windlass, when about all of the second chair had run out, I let drop the pawl or the stopper and that anchor having time to catch, (being on muddy bottom) took all the strain, when I brought up again and held on until the chain parted near the anchor; but no tuntil sometime after I had dropped it. Provious to which, the other ship had parted her chain, made storm other chain parted also—the which I mention to make manifest that it was no "cat's paw" we had. During the time the second anchor had the strain, I had some anxiety for the ship's bow, as she is in had some anxiety for the ship's low, as she is in the decline of life; but no harm came of it whatever. So far as whating ships are concerned, I must say your stoppers are invaluable, for in cutting in a whale at anchor! throw the chain off the windlass to the stopper, whereast have had some trouble here-



American Officers in Russia.-We are glad at length to have something definite and reliable respecting the three American army officers, Major Delasteld and Captains Mordecai and McClellan, who were sent out by our government some months since, to inspect the fortifications and operations of the belligerents in the East. They went first to London and then at Paris, at both of which places they seem to have been received rather coolly .-They then went to Berlin; and the report has been current, that the Russian government had also given them the cold shoulder, and they were about to return home without accomplishing the object of their mission. But the Washington Union contradicts this last report, and says that so far from havitg been coldly received by the Russians, they had been thus far treated with distinguished consideration by the representatives of the Czar. On their arrival at Berlin, it says they were welcomed and entertained by the Russian Minister in the most cordial manner; and when they reached Warsaw, Prince Paskiewitch greeted them with splendid hospitality. He gave them a grand review of the troops, and ordered an engineer officer to show them the fortifications, &c. They had been offered a choice between an invitation from the Emperor, first, to visit the Russian capital, St. Petersburgh, or to be expressed to the Crimea. They had chosen to go on first, to St. Petersburg, where they had arrived, at previous accounts, and have doubtless received from the Czar every facility for pursuing their mission in the most satisfactory manner.

THE BUFFALO RECRUITS .- The trial of Count Kazimski and three others taken from the British brig Buffalo, by the officers of the U.S. revenue cutter Campbell, at Tarpaulin Cove, charged with enlisting soldiers forthe Crimea, was commenced in the U. S District Court in Beston on Monday, before Judge Sprague. B. F. Hallett appeared for the prosecution, and Messrs. Andrew and Burt for the defence. The prisoners all pleaded not guilty.

Boston Traveller.

Mr. Hallett stated the case for the prosecution, as affecting the neutrality laws of this country, by which this country was bound not to interfere with the conflicts of other powers. The present prosecution he said arose from the circumstance that the prisoners were found on board of a British vessel bound from New York to Halifax with 21 men on board mostly laborers, who had been retained under false pretences, and as he should be able to show with the intention of carrying them to the seat of war in the Crimea, there to be enlisted as soldiers. The examination of witnesses was then entered upon. Several of the witnesses testified that they had been engaged to labor, some in Hartford, and others on railroads at the West, but without any suspicion on their part that they were to be enlisted in a foreign service, until they found that the vessel in which they had been embarked was bound for Halifax, and their requests to be put ashore were refused. The case is still on trial.

ENGLAND'S SINEWS OF WAR .- 'cme idea of the magnitude of British exports may be formed from the following facts stated in the June number of the Statistical Journal: From 1840 to 1853 the aggregate amount of British exports exceed the national dept by nearly £100,000,000; the declared value of British and Irish exports having been \$77,-299,124, while during the same period the highest amount of the national debt was only £791,809,339

In 1853 the exports amounted to nearly a hundred millions sterling, the amount having increased in fourteen years about 83 per cent. These exports were distributed to foreign countries and British possessions in the proportion of 66 to 34 per cent. respectively. The bulk of the foreign exports was principally to Europe and North and South America. Of the exports to British possessions, the East Indies took the largest proportion until 1853, when the Australian exceeded the Indian exports.

To show the effect of free trade, in 1832 the total value of exports was £36,420,594; in 1853 the amount was £98,933,781; the most rapid advance having been made since 1848. The effect of the gold discoveries in the United States and Australia has been to stimulate trade. The exports in the four years from 1850 to 1853, to the United States had been increased to the extent of £14,500,000 by gold. With respect to Australia in 1852 and 1853 the only years influenced by gold, the exports had risen £11,500,000. So that, during four years, the gold discoveries had already stimulated trade to the extent of £26,000,000.

PRICES OF WHEAT AND FLOUR.—Considerable of the new crop of wheat has arrived in the Baltimore market, and on Saturday there was a decline of 3 or 4 cents per bushel, selling at \$2.25 to \$2.35, and closing with a drooping tendency under the expectation of large receipts this week. As yet, little or no new flour has been manufactured and come into market, and on account of scarcity, the price of that article is actually rising whilst the "raw material" is declining. Millers and farmers at Vincennes, Ind., on the 3d inst., were closing contracts for wheat at \$1 a bushel, deliverable in 10 to 15 days. The Vincennes Gazette predicts that in August, flour will be down to \$6.50 per bbl. in that place, and by the first of January to \$4,50 or and the state of Ed nament
