of my heart for my sins past present and future humbly beseeching forgiveness for the same
and committ[ing] my soule unto almighty god my sovereign and [unclear]
hand and by the merites of Jesus Christ of mercy and [unclear]
to be spirit and have full remission and forgiveness of all my sins of that
my soule with my body at the generall day of judgement shall [unclear]
joy through the merites of Christs death and passion [unclear] and for [unclear]
Kingdom of heaven prepared for his elect and chosen and my body to be
in such place where I shall please my executors: first being and bequeath to my
son samuelt fashbon the whole and abate which stand more of his house
for ever comes to the house of I leave my wife Margaret fashbon my executrix
of all my movables and house goods houses and churche goods [unclear] and
I leave the furniture of my house at newport for her life time and [unclear]
the worst part of my house at newport and the [unclear] of that [unclear]
part that she does hang on and the shop to be left for my son [unclear]
son John and his heirs for ever and the Eastward end of the said house
and the best of the bantys to be left for my son william fashbon son John and
heirs for ever: and the yard to be equally for their youde and I leave [unclear]
for my lifetime the twenty acres of land which I bought of [unclear]
where standing of 100 [unclear] and [unclear] and the [unclear] of the house which
I bought of [unclear] that my four sons shall pay to my wife [unclear]

will performed in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my seal in blackisland aforesaid the tenth day of february in the year
of our lord one thousand seven hundred and two
